According to its fundamental programmatic policy, *a journal for integrative thought*. This means that it accepts and nurtures pluralism of philosophical positions, holds its primary philosophical sphere open to other spiritual and scientific approaches and aims to establish a network between the various theoretical perspectives in the paradigm of creating orientative knowledge.

As an open access journal, **Synthesis philosophica** supports the concept of open science and does not charge for its service. All content is freely available to users or their institutions at no charge.
